

This month we feature our Music teacher, Dr. Paul Bodene Smith.

Dr. Paul Smith has taught for over 20 years in public school, and public and private universities and is presently on faculty at the Manhattan Virtual School and Central Michigan University. Originally from the Chicago area, he relocated to Europe to advance his singing career. After twelve years and some 1500 performance in thirteen different countries later, Dr. Smith and his family returned to Illinois where he finished his studies before he began his teaching career. 
### What's your word?

### ACT Opportunity for Juniors and Seniors

The Kansas Legislature appropriated funds to offer **one free ACT assessment and one free WorkKeys suite of assessment to all public high school juniors. They are also being offered free of charge to seniors who have not yet taken one or the other.** For example, if a senior has taken the ACT, he or she may take WorkKeys at this time. If a senior has taken WorkKeys, he or she may take the ACT at this time.
