



Cooking Club - Mrs. MG's Zoom Link on Thursday,


This month K-2 students are learning about living things in science. Students are exploring the parts of plants and animals as well as comparing them to find similarities and differences.

 Plug in different answer choices to see what makes the most sense.








Bridgette Blue, 3rd grade student, won 5th place at the state wrestling meet in her weight division.
