



State Assessments

State Assessments are almost here and all 7th, 8th, 10th and 11th Graders will take content assessments. (9th and 12th grades do not test...luckies)!

The following outlines the assessments by grade level.

7th Graders – Math, ELA 8th Graders – Math, ELA, Science, Social Studies

10th Graders – Math, ELA

11th Graders – Science, Social Studies

We have scheduled one day at each test site during the week of April 16-20. Each test has two parts, and each part will take approximately 45 minutes. However, in our experience, the tests do not take this long. You will receive an email the second week of March with sign up information.

The start time is 9:30. Please plan to arrive on time so that we may begin promptly at the scheduled time.
